This is the small pattern.

Notes:

- The pink dotted line is the cutting line for perforated paper or plastic aida.
- When stitching please take care to not make any jumps that can be seen from the front OR might get in the way of cutting out the shape afterwards.
- When cutting please take care not to cut too close to the stitching, if you cut away to a hole where there's a stitch it can come undone.

All stitches that cross more than one stitch corner to corner are straight stitches, all others are backstitch.
