This week's Friday Freebie is inspired by the Weavers Tapestry patterns on the Antique Pattern Library. Some elements from this pattern can also be found on the Weavers Tapestry Band Sampler that I'm hosting as a SAL on my blog (with a fb group too!), but not all.

If you are planning on joining in with the SAL this would make a great addition to your sewing kit! This pattern also lets you try out the threads before you start to see if you like the combination should you choose to use more than one thread or would like to test the fabric and thread together before starting.

I have given the pattern for a pincushion and a fob, though the fob would make a great mini pincushion too.

If you are making this on 14ct Aida or 28ct evenweave you will need a skein of thread for it, if you are using finer fabric you will need less.

Note:

The patterns need to be spaced further apart when you stitch them - at least 1/2" or 1,5 cm - I have done them closer together so they fit on a single page.
