If you don't have a BB-8 fob in your life you need to make one now!

Notes:

Please note that next to the cross stitch antenna is a backstitched one as well - it's the dotted line one stitch to the right and one stitch higher (a solid line just didn't show up at all).

I dripped coffee onto a wet bit of 18ct Aida and let the colour bleed over the fabric to create the desert sand effect.

I used Ecru and light brown craft thread to make the cord

The brown backstitched line is the line used to stitch the whole fob together.

How to sew the fob together:

- Cut the embroidery to a few stitches past the backstitched edge.
- Fold over all the seam lines, they won't all stay in place but the first fold does seem to help things fold better when you get to them.
- Fold the two sides towards each other, they are about to become the back seam.
- Whip stitch starting at the bottom and working towards the point.
- Then go down one of the sides of the fob working from the point to the side.
- Finish off the thread.
- If you haven't already make the cord to attach your fob to your scissors.
- Slip it into place at the top and whip stitch the second top seam.
- Stuff your fob and whip stitch the last seam closed.
