I have put french knots on the pattern as that was the easiest way to show it but what I really had in mind was small gold sequins with a matching gold bead to hold it in place. Or you could use just gold beads, but I would definitely not recommend trying french knots with Kreinik.

Please note that the blended colours are listed twice! Once as a normal colour in the main legend and once with the actual colours needed. Please read it all through before stash diving or buying colours as it will make it easier for you.

Many people think that blended colours are scary and this pattern lets you try them out before committing to a bigger pattern with lots of blended colours. Blended colours are a lot easier than they sound! All you need is one strand of each colour called for and use them as if they are a single colour - that's it! Nothing else, no hidden tricks or anything. As long as you are careful about which colours you grab you will be fine!

While the pattern does call for blended colours, if you prefer you can of course always go for a non-blended version with a completely different pallet than the one given!
