

Christmas in July - Day 9 - Kida by Magical525

This is the 9th of the 31 patterns that I will be giving on my blog over the month.

Today's pattern is inspired by the mucha princess patterns Pinky the Pink has made, this one uses the colours of Kida which you can find here: <u>http://tinyurl.com/y7mcgguo</u> (if it hasn't sold out yet as it's a limited edition pattern). All diagonal lines except the green stem lines should be done with a straight stitch - so the needle only goes through the fabric at the beginning and ending of the line.

This pattern calls for it to be fully stitched with a light blue, If you prefer you can use a light blue fabric instead and just do the back stitched and straight stitched area's.

While the pattern does call for a Light Effects red floss, if you prefer you can of course always go for a non-sparkly version with the same colour number, or perhaps even a completely different pallet than the one given! Make it yours if you like, I'm all for it!

The + in the centre is the middle of the pattern, marked for your stitching ease. The black backstitched line is the seam line of the stockings should you join them into a single stocking. I'd suggest whip stitching them together wrong sides facing.
